# The Challenge

- RFP 2022
  - Contacted 8+ potential program administrators
  - Only 1 completed a bid
  - Complexities and work required discouraged bidders

#### Current Contract

- Renewal in summer 2024
- Exit clause:
  - With cause: 90-days notice
  - Without cause: 240-days notice
  - Duplicate conditions for WSOS/501C



## **Recommendation:**

Amend the statute to grant Board of Directors express authority to create and contract directly with a non-profit created for the purpose of administering the Opportunity Scholarship program.

#### WHAT THIS ACCOMPLISHES

- Gives authority to the Board to create a non-profit(s) with the express purpose of administering the Opportunity Scholarship program
  - If granted: 1) Board/staff could create a nonprofit without violating state ethics rules; but 2) after incorporation, the non-profit(s) must operate as an independent entity with a separate governing Board.
- Grants the Board authority to contract directly with the created non-profit without going out for a public bid

#### WHAT THIS PRESERVES

- Makes no change to the description of program administrator duties
- Does not require the Board to create a non-profit(s); makes it an option
- Does not require the Board directly delegate the work to a created nonprofit(s) - can still use an RFP process to select from other bidders; makes it an option



# WSOS Board of Directors

Mission: WA students for WA jobs

Oversee WSOS Program's ED

Duties as defined in statute (programs, awards, fundraising, external affairs)

# "WSOS Foundation" Board of Directors

Mission: Serve WSOS
Program mission by providing
back office

Oversee WSOS Foundation's FD

Duties as defined in statute assigned to the program administrator (HR, IT, Finance)

### WSAC

Signer on three-party agreement

Duties as defined in the statute assigned to WSAC (state match, RFP process)

## **Risk Assessment**

- Risk: Program administrator exercises 240-day exit or does not renew, and no one bids.
  - **Solution**: Board has ability to create its own non-profit and contract with it directly for program administration duties.
- Risk: WSOS-specific non-profit is created but disagreements exist leading to a
  desire to dissolve.
  - **Solution**: Board retains right to go to public bid for other administrators or create other non-profit(s) for the purpose of program administration.
- Risk: Possible violation of ethics laws for Board/staff to participate in creation of non-profit (conflict of interest).
  - Solution: No concern remains once authority is expressly granted to take such action.

#### Outstanding:

- Direct contracting question may be difficult for legislators
- Need tax lawyer to confirm nature of private funds



### **Recommendation:**

While bill is open, strike confusing language regarding state match process.

#### WHAT THIS ACCOMPLISHES

- Strikes reference to requiring a fiscal year lag from when private monies are granted and when state match is appropriated
  - If granted: 1) Avoids differing interpretations of how the state match is calculated; and 2) expedites the receipt of state matching dollars.

#### WHAT THIS PRESERVES

 Retains the state match for WSOS as a maintenance level funding item
